GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 2.0 GPA (unweighted)
- Financial Literacy completion (0.5 credit)
- Level 3 or higher on the 10th grade Reading FAST
- Level 3 or higher on the Algebra 1 FAST exam



Other Important Testing:

Geometry, Biology, US History EOC = 30% of overall grade!

STEP 2: PICK YOUR ELECTIVES

- ___ **2-D Studio Art 1** (Overview of drawing, painting, and art history)
- ___ **AP Computer Science Principles** (must have passed Alg 1; will learn central ideas of computer science)
- ___ **Acting** (for students serious about performing on stage)
- ___ **Technical Theater Design/Production** (support the theater program-construction/lighting/sound)
- ___ **Spanish 1 or 2** (learn the basics of the Spanish language)
- ___ **French 1** (learn the basics of the French language)
- ___ **Chorus** (learn to sing or advance your vocal abilities)
- ___ **Guitar** (learn to play the guitar no experience necessary)
- ___ **Band** (concert and marching band for brass, woodwinds, and percussion instruments)
- ___ **Jazz Ensemble** (Class for advanced musicians) *must take Band concurrently*
- ___ **Orchestra** (for all string instruments: violin, viola, cello, and double bass)
- ___ **AVID** (Focus on college readiness, organization, study skills)
- ___ **ROTC** (become a leader though ARMY leadership principles) *2 years of course waives PE and Fine art credit*
- ___ **Personal Fitness/Fitness Design** (PE class required for graduation)

STEP 3: CHOOSE AN ACADEMIC PATHWAYS (CTE):

___ **Agri-science** (4H and FFA learn about large animals and modern farming techniques)

___ **Digital Video** (HD cameras, professional grade broadcasting studio, and editing software)

___ **Introduction to Engineering Design** (overview of the engineer field/use of computers and hands on activities)

___ **Digital Information Technology** (overview of basic computer functions and computer programming)

___ **Criminal Justice 1** (prepare for further education and careers in Law, Public Safety and Security)

___ **Game and Simulation Foundations** (use the history of Gaming to learn game concepts then create video games)

___ **Vet Assisting 1** (introduction to the animal industry and veterinary medicine)

___ **Foundations of Journalism** (Develop fundamental skills through the writing process for varied journalistic media)

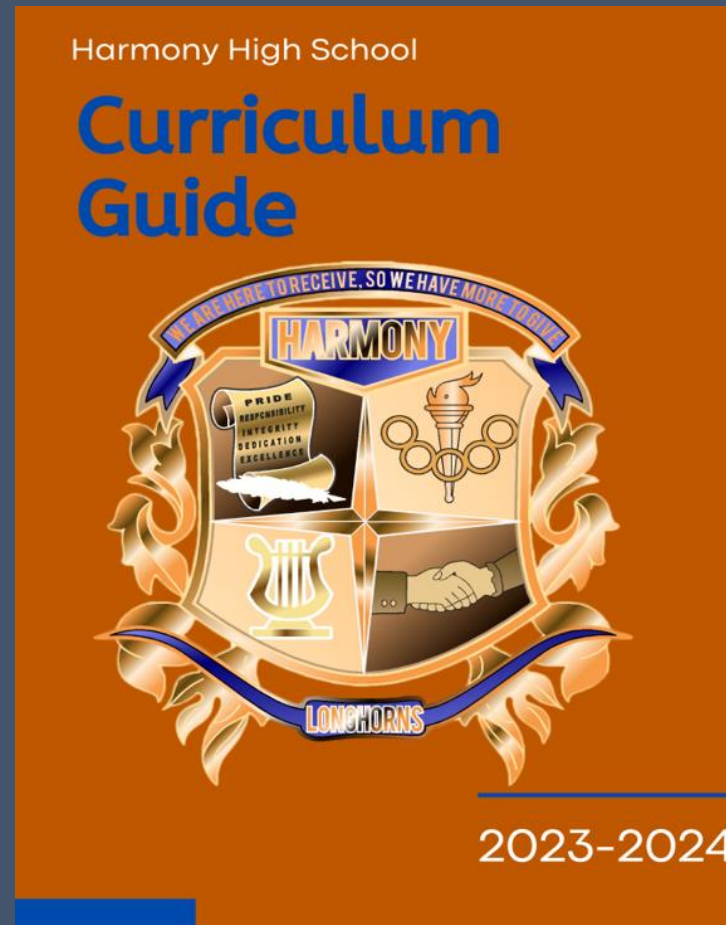
