FLORIDA'S DIVERSE ECOSYSTEMS AND SPECIES

Conservation and Protection

The State of Florida has seen tremendous growth in recent years. Unfortunately, with this growth, there has also been habitat loss for various plant and animal life due to the expansion of agricultural and urban development taking place throughout the State. Florida with its warm climate and natural wonders has an astonishing diversity of ecosystems and species. It is also part of the North American Coastal Plain which ranges from Texas to Florida to New England and was recognized in 2016 as the 36th biodiversity hotspot in the world.

Biodiversity hotspot in the world sounds alarming, right? It is and that is why Florida lawmakers recently approved \$207.4 million for habitat and species conservation. Florida has endemic plant species that are not found anywhere else in the world and have experienced habitat loss. According to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, there are seven categories with over 130 species that make up the imperiled species list in Florida; these include birds, mammals, invertebrates, saltwater fish, freshwater fish, reptiles, and amphibians. Environmental Study Center
